And while he was responsible in his duties as a fine brother, he was prone to merciless tickling (sending and receiving), purple Hermans, noogies, etc. You get the picture, he could at once be your staunchest ally, and alternately tease you as only a brother can. He had a silly sense of humor and would practice baseball with girls (if they could catch and throw), and loved our backyard pool. Although that may have worn-off a bit when maintaining the pool became one of his chores.

He loved music and singing, baseball and bowling. We all went to the movies often on Saturdays and we loved spending our holidays with all of our Rondeau, Flanagan, and Alcorn cousins. And though his contact with our youngest brother, Dillon, was infrequent, whenever they were together at family gatherings it seemed as though their conversation picked up where it had left off however many years previous.

About 1979, after a brief stint in the Navy, Rod ended up in Carson City, where our parents had relocated in 1974.
