Roman looks ahead to 2018 season

After suffering through a second non-winning season, Carson

High football coach Blair Roman is already looking ahead to next season.

Yes, CHS football fans, Roman is coming back for his 11th season.

Roman has posted a 73-38 record, including six seasons when he won nine or more games.

"How much longer I can do this, I don't know," Roman said Wednesday morning in his football office. "I feel a little less energy and less patience dealing with off-the-field issues that we had last year."

Roman said he's in the process of evaluating the entire program and seeing where things could be improved.

The 2017 season was one that was plagued by injuries. Carson lost six starters for the season — quarterback Daniel Morrison, lineman Blaise Bonomo, defensive back Kyle Glanzmann, defensive back-running back Bradley Maffei, running back Chance Smith and defensive lineman Chandler Tiearny, who missed the last 1 1/2 games.

"We somewhat recovered (from) losing Blaise, but not Daniel," Roman said.

The loss of Morrison meant entering the season with two untested quarterbacks, Jonny Laplante and Blake Menzel, neither of whom had ever taken a
