Based on the rubric scoring system the committee determined that publisher presentations were not necessary to select a chemistry textbook for adoption. By following the textbook adoption process the committee could determine that Houghton, Mifflin, Harcourt: Modern Chemistry is best aligned with the NVACS and NGSS standards, as well as the curriculum that was developed by the Chemistry departments at Carson and Pioneer High Schools.

Of all the materials that was provided and reviewed, the resources presented within Modern Chemistry was best alignment and would best support CCSD student's in mastering the goals set within CCSD, NVAC, and NGSS learning standards.
