Mission Statement

In partnership with the community, we will make the most of every day for every student by empowering them with the skills, knowledge, values and opportunities to thrive.

Superintendent's Highlights

While no single report can tell the complete story of our educational accomplishments, the following are a few highlights from our District of the 2014-2015 school year:

- Approximately 2,100 laptop computers were provided to students in grades 3-5 as part of phase 3 of the District's 1:1 Mobile Device Initiative
- The Jump Start College program allows high school students to earn dual credit toward high school graduation and also a college degree
- The governing Boards of the District and City meet jointly, twice a year to discuss education needs and accomplishments in the community
- Local school bonds allowed the District to build controlled entrances as safety measures at all of its school sites
- Free, full-day Kindergarten is available in all of the District's elementary schools
- The Community PLC meets quarterly as a committee of citizens and school personnel to monitor and adjust progress of the District's Strategic Plan
- About 100 English Language Learners living in needy attendance zones enrolled in special Pre-Kindergarten classes thanks to special state funding
- Gifted and Academically Talented Education (GATE) programming was made available via a cluster model to identified students in grades 3-5
- The pass rate for algebra I students improved from 72% to 88% during the first year of implementing more rigorous math expectations

Goals and Objectives

- 1. Continue to develop and implement the "LearnerCentered" model to improve student academic growth in the District.
 - a. Continue efforts to increase staff efficacythrough teacher professional development.
 - b. Challenge students academically with rigorous, meaningful curriculum and support their efforts with school-based assistanceand by engaging parents to a greater degree.
 - c. Use classroomdata to identify struggling students and focus teacher time and resources toprevent failing grades and early credit deficiency.
- 2. Re-convene the Master Plan Committee to develop the next five years of Bond Projects and Capital Projects. The Strategic Plan will guide the discussionabout potential facilities.
- 3. Work with Trustees, staff, community partners, school principals, and Nevada Photo Source to develop and implement a DistrictCommunication Plan.

- 4. Work with Staff and community partners to open asustainable school based health center.
- 5. Roll out high school 1:1 mobile deviceinitiative.

District Communication Efforts

The Carson City School District televises the Board of Trustees through access television twice each month. Each school distributes a monthly newsletter to parents and community members as a means of keeping the public informed about school activities, programs, and events. Elementary schools hosted Parent/Teacher conferences at the end of the first quarter, and then again at the end of the third quarter. Test results and interpretation guides are sent home at the completion of each standardized test cycle. Each school maintains a website providing school-wide information. The district provides a website (www.carsoncityschools.com) where parents and community members can obtain information regarding policies, procedures, curriculum and assessment results. Elementary schools utilize PeeChee folders to communicate with parents on a weekly basis. Each school hosts school-wide activities to encourage parent participation, i.e. science fairs, family reading nights, math nights, and a variety of other social events. The high schools and middle schools utilize PowerSchool so parents have access to grades and announcements 24 hours a day via the computer. A bilingual parent liaison was hired to service our K-12 parents.

Discipline

It is the policy of this District to provide regular in-service education and training about harassment, sexual harassment, intimidation, and bullying for employees and students. Such in-service and training shall include:

- Awareness concerning the various types of bullying, harassment and intimidation; how the bullying, harassment and intimidation manifests itself, and the devastating emotional and educational consequences that may occur.
- Training in the appropriate methods to facilitate positive human relations among pupils without the use of bullying, harassment and intimidation so that pupils may realize their full academic and personal potential.
- Methods to improve the school environment in a manner that will facilitate positive human relations among pupils.
- Methods to teach skills to pupils so that pupils are able to replace inappropriate behavior with positive behavior.
