### **Mission Statement**

In partnership with families and the community, we will make the most of every day for every student by empowering them with the skills, knowledge, values and opportunities to thrive.

### Superintendent's Highlights

While no single report can tell the complete story of our education accomplishments, the following highlights occurred during the 2017-2018 school year.

- Carson City School District's graduation rate increased to 83.9%. Carson High School's graduation rate is 93.2% and Pioneer High School's graduation rate in 80.9%. Both high schools completed the school accreditation process this year.
- Carson City School District proudly endorses an educational model that focuses on the needs of each individual learner.
   Our teachers use powerful student data systems to support student learning and facilitate program completion.
- Carson City School District has six elementary schools, two middle schools, a comprehensive high school, a small
  alternative high school, on-line educational options, adult education, and a dual-credit program that allows students to
  obtain an Associate Degree from Western Nevada College while also earning the credit needed to graduate from high
  school.
- The Carson City School District Board of Trustees meets semi-annually with the Carson City Board of Supervisors to discuss matters of mutual interest and benefit to our community.
- Carson City School District's Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs had 97.15% of its students pass the State's Work Readiness Assessment.
- Carson City School District and community partners meet quarterly and discuss the progress attaining the goals, objectives, and strategies of the District's Strategic Plan, "Empower Carson City 2022".
- Carson City School District with support from the Nevada Legislature and the Governor employs 14 social workers in our schools to help families receive basic physical, social, and emotional services.
- Carson City School District passed a \$15 million dollar capital improvement school bond that will remove all portable classrooms in the district and replace them with permanent brick and mortar classrooms.
- Carson City School District embraces the use of technology and provides laptop computers for students in grades 3-12.
   Laptop computers are also available for each Kindergarten through 2nd Grade student in their individual classrooms.
- Carson City School District launched the University of Nevada's course "Introduction to Education (EDU-110)" to
  approximately 20 high school 11th and 12th graders. The dual-credit offering is the District's attempt to introduce the filed
  of education as a career pathway to interested students and as a potential solution to alleviate future teacher shortages.
- Carson City School District's communication department distributes quarterly newsletters to nearly 16,000 individuals
  throughout Carson City. Recipients include students, parents, guardians, and staff. In addition, about 100 news releases
  were sent last year to northern Nevada Media outlets.

#### **District Communication Efforts**

The Carson City School District televises the Board of Trustees through access television twice each month. Each school distributes a monthly newsletter to parents and community members as a means of keeping the public informed about school activities, programs, and events. Elementary schools hosted Parent/Teacher conferences at the end of the first quarter, and then again at the end of the third quarter. Test results and interpretation guides are sent home at the completion of each standardized test cycle. Each school maintains a website providing school-wide information. The district provides a website (<a href="www.carsoncityschools.com">www.carsoncityschools.com</a>) where parents and community members can obtain information regarding policies, procedures, curriculum and assessment results. Elementary schools utilize PeeChee folders to communicate with parents on a weekly basis. Each school hosts school-wide activities to encourage parent participation, i.e science fairs, family reading nights, math nights and a variety of other social events. The high schools and middle schools utilize Infinite Campus so parents have access to grades, attendance and announcements 24 hours a day via the computer.

### **Discipline**

It is the policy of the Carson City School District to provide regular in-service education and training about harassment, sexual harassment, intimidation, and bullying for employees and students. Such in-service training shall include:

- Awareness concerning the various types of bullying, harassment, and intimidations; how the bullying, harassment and intimidation manifests itself, and the devastating emotional and educational consequences that may occur.
- Training in the appropriate methods to facilitate positive human relations among pupils without the use of bullying, harassment and intimidation so that pupils may realize their full academic and personal potential.
- Methods to improve the school environment in a manner that will facilitate positive human relations among pupils.
- Methods to teach skills to pupils so that they are able to replace inappropriate behavior with positive behavior.
