

















SBAC (state exams for reading and math- Grades 3-5)



### Math and Reading SBAC 2018-2022








MAP:

### 3rd- 5th Projected Proficiency for SBAC based on MAP












### ACCESS-English Language Acquisition



### Percent of Students Exiting as English Proficient








## ATTENDANCE: Chronic Absenteeism-

- Our main priority will be to keep our students safe





#### MULTI HAZARD PLAN

DEVELOPED IN COOPERATION WITH LOCAL EMERGENCY RESPONDERS

CONTEMPLATES THOSE HAZARDS IDENTIFIED IN THE CARSON CITY HAZARD & VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT + DISTRICT ASSESSMENTS

HAZARDS AND VULNERABILITIES ARE DEFINED AS NATURAL, CHEMICAL OR MAN-MADE

### EXAMPLES OF HAZARDS

NATURAL: EARTHQUAKE, FLOOD, INCLEMENT WEATHER

CHEMICAL: GAS LEAK, CHEMICAL RELEASE, SPILL

MAN MADE: THREATS/ACTS OF VIOLENCE, CYBER ATTACKS, ARSON



### VIOLENCE : PREVENTION

- A. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
- B. "If You See Something, Say Something®"
- C. SafeVoice anonymous reporting system used to report threats to the safety or well-being of students.
- D. Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management provides a proactive, evidence-based approach for identifying individuals who may pose a threat and for providing interventions before a violent incident occurs. The District Behavioral Threat Assessment Team (TAT) is trained to respond to student threats and identify those students who may be on a "path to violence".

#### **VIOLENCE: PROTECTION**

The District Visitor Management System (VMS) screens every visitor against sex offender databases, confirms the identity of each visitor and helps staff and students recognize approved individuals with detailed visitor badges. Volunteers on property are screened through a similar process and must also wear identification badges at all times when working on school property.

Physical protection – secure perimeter, single point entry

### VIOLENCE: PROTECTION

SROs serve as trusted adults within the school community. The presence of responsible, caring adults in a student life is a protective element that can contribute to a student's ability to avoid destructive behaviors, make good choices, and survive the challenges that family, socio-economic, racial, and other circumstances can present.

#### **VIOLENCE: MITIGATION**

Efforts made to reduce the severity of threats and/or acts of violence include the following:

Trainings, drills and exercises that make best use of resources, maximize effectiveness, and minimize physical and psychological risks.

Stop the Bleed, CPR, First Aid, AED's

### VIOLENCE: RESPONSE

All response decisions made during and after an Active Assailant incident will be based on the following standardized order of priorities:

- 1. Life Safety
- 2. Incident Stabilization
- 3. Property Preservation

### **RESPONSE: LOCKDOWN**

Standard Response Protocol
Classroom strategy - Lights, Locks, Out of Sight
Alternatives include self-evacuation, hiding,
defending

### VIOLENCE: RECOVERY

Reunification

Post-incident recovery may include activation of the Medical, Public and Mental Health Plans

Family Assistance Center

Continuity Of Operations Plan (COOP) to ensure the continued delivery of educational programs.
